STEUBENVILLE ST. PAUL

July 26-28, 2019

Lodging Accommodations – All students and chaperones will stay on the campus of St. Thomas Catholic University in the dormitories. Some students (and possibly even chaperones) may have to sleep on the floor, and many of the rooms are not air conditioned.

Food – Meals during the conference are all on site, and meals included with the registration fee are dinner on Friday, breakfast, lunch and dinner on Saturday, and breakfast on Sunday. Lunch on Sunday is a surcharge which our group will purchase. Students will need additional money on the way there for lunch, as well as additional money for dinner on the way home.

Merchandise – Merchandise from various Catholic vendors will be available at the conference. Some of these vendors are those who are presenting at the conference. This is an extra cost that students would need to bring money with them if they would like to purchase something.

Transportation – We will take a charter bus to and from St. Paul. Departure location and time will be determined once a contract is secured and we know the most common meeting point for all those attending the event.

REGISTERING

There will be a paper registration form for you to fill out and turn in, but there will also be an online registration and liability waiver to fill out for the group that manages this particular Steubenville event, Partnership for Youth. Also, a \$50 nonrefundable deposit will be due in order for a spot to be guaranteed. See the “TIMELINES” section for more information regarding this deposit.

FRANCISCAN STEUBENVILLE LEAD

Steubenville LEAD is a week long retreat option for those who want to develop and grow in their leadership and evangelization skills. LEAD week precedes the Steubenville conference, and then those students who attended LEAD will give testimonies and act as leaders for their group throughout the weekend. If you are interested to learn more about this option, there is an application process, so please see Jen Sagel for more information.

CHAPERONES

We will need chaperones for the trip, as Steubenville has a requirement of one adult for every 7 students specific to each gender. If you are interested in chaperoning, please see Jen Sagel. All chaperones MUST be Safe Environment trained.

FUNDRAISING

We understand that experiences like this don't come cheap. But we also believe greatly in their lasting impact, so we want to help in any way possible to help defray costs. Fundraising is available to both students and chaperones. This year we are organizing FUNDRAISING DINNERS – one in Dixon and one in Sterling. This is how it will work: any student or chaperone who comes to help with the meal will get an equal portion of the money that is raised that particular night. Students and chaperones may choose to attend one dinner, both dinners, or neither dinner. There is an expectation that registrants be there to help. Putting on a dinner and doing it well is a lot of work – there is prep work, set up, serving, and lots of cleaning. We will keep track of who attends each night and how much is raised, then divide it equally. So, while all registrants will start with the same dollar amount that is owed, not all will be required to pay that full amount depending on participation in the fundraisers.

The dinner in Dixon will be March 6th at the Holloway Center. This is Ash Wednesday, and we will encourage people to kick off their Lent with prayer, penance and almsgiving. Details regarding the dinner itself will follow. Please mark on your registration form if you would like more information about the Dixon dinner.

The date and location for dinner in Sterling has yet to be determined. Details will follow. Please mark on your registration form if you would like more information about the Sterling dinner.

The Knights of Columbus Council from Dixon also offered to have one of their monthly Chicken and Steak Dinners benefit those attending Steubenville. The date reserved for our group is February 16 so we will need some help at the Hall that night, as well as help possibly selling tickets ahead of time.

TIMELINE

A \$50 **nonrefundable** deposit is due basically as soon as possible. **Early registration opens November 15.** Because the Kenosha, WI site is not an option this year, it is hard to say if St. Paul will sell out. So, we have to purchase tickets with our best guess of how many students and chaperones we will have. It is very likely that last minute additions will not be feasible. Registration is technically open until June 26, but I would expect that a waitlist will have been established by then. Also, prices increase the longer you wait. The sooner you turn in your \$50 deposit, the more likely you are to be guaranteed a spot.

Final payment will be due Monday May 13th. If it is easier for you to work out some sort of payment plan, please speak with us and we can set something up, although remember that final cost will be dependent upon if you choose to help fundraise and how that goes.

TIMELINE CONTINUED

NOVEMBER 15 Registration Opens [\$50 nonrefundable deposit due] Registrations *may* be able to be accepted after this date, but only should the event not sell out. Also, the price we are quoting is for Early Bird registration pricing-should the event not sell out, and if you choose to register after Jan 17, your cost will be \$15 more.
